

2022 Imparja Cup Eligibility Criteria

1. GRADING ELIGIBILITY

- 1.1 Any player who actively participates for a Major Centre side is not permitted to play in the community men's division in the same year except:
- 1.2 Any female who players in the Major Centre side is permitted to play in the Community Women's or Community Men's divisions.
 - 1.2.1 Strictly no exemptions will be considered.
- 1.3 Players are permitted to play up i.e. may play for a community division side and then play in a Major Centre match, however once that player has played in a Major Centre match, they are ineligible to return to the Community Men's division, as set out above.
- 1.4 Any team who fields an ineligible player will automatically lose any points awarded for the match(es) in which an ineligible player has participated.

2. INDIGENOUS PLAYERS – ELIGIBILITY

- 2.1 Men: Players wanting to participate in the Major Centre's division must be of the Indigenous (Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander) decent.

Any player wanting to participate in the Community Men's division of the Imparja Cup must be of Indigenous (Aboriginal and or Torres Strait Islander) decent, ***except where an eligibility exemption is sought.***

- 2.2 Women: There is no restriction on the number of Non-Indigenous women who may compete for a team in the community women's division.

- 2.2.1 It is important to note that one of the objectives of the Imparja Cup is to promote Indigenous women to actively participate in cricket and therefore teams are encouraged to actively attract and involve Indigenous women in their sides.

- 2.2.2 Players wanting to participate in the community women's division need not apply for eligibility exemption.

3 NON-INDIGENOUS PLAYERS – ELIGIBILITY

- 3.1 Major Centre players must be of Indigenous (Aboriginal and or Torres Strait Islander) decent. No eligibility exemptions will be accepted for Major Centre teams in 2022.
- 3.2 Community Men's division sides may apply for eligibility exemption for ***two players*** of Non-Indigenous descent.
- 3.3 NB: The use of Non-Indigenous players is not granted automatically. Every player of Non-Indigenous descent wanting to participate must first apply to the Imparja Cup eligibility panel for eligibility exemption and must be approved by the Imparja Cup eligibility panel.
 - 3.3.1 NB: Eligibility exemption from 2019 or previous Imparja Cup's does not automatically transfer to the 2022 Imparja Cup.

2022 Imparja Cup Eligibility Exemption form

Any persons of Non-Indigenous descent wishing to participate in the Imparja Cup must first apply for Eligibility Exemption, in writing, using the form below.

Successful applicants will need to demonstrate an extensive contribution to the development of Indigenous Communities.

Major Centres

No eligibility exemptions will be accepted for the 2022 Major Centres division.

Community Men's Division

Exemptions may be sought for two Non-Indigenous players for each team.

Women's Community Division

Does not apply, no exemption required.

Once an application for Eligibility Exemption is received, the Imparja Cup Advisory Committee will meet to consider, approve, decline or otherwise the application. Successful and unsuccessful applicants will receive a written response from the Imparja Cup Advisory Committee by 11 February 2022. (Major Centre Division). The decision of the Imparja Cup Advisory Committee is final and binding.
